ST ANN'S ATTRIBUTES

SIZE OF WARD (SQ. KM), ST ANN'S

- At 1.1 sq. km, St Ann's is smaller than the Haringey average (1.6 sq. km), and less than half the size of the average London ward (2.6 sq. km).
- St Ann's is the second smallest ward in the borough (joint with Hornsey and Stroud Green).


LONDON AVERAGE HARINGEY MAX

POPULATION, ST ANN'S


• St Ann's has a larger population than the average Haringey (14,275) or London (13,854) ward, at 16,043 residents.

POPULATION DENSITY (RESIDENTS PER SQ. KM), ST ANN'S

- Population density in St Ann's is higher than average, at 14,719 residents per sq. km (compared to an average of 10,453 in Haringey and 8,894 in London).
- St Ann's has the second highest population density of all Haringey wards.



OPEN SPACE, ST ANN'S

• 20% of St Ann's ward is made up of open space, below the Haringey (25.2%) and London (27.2%) averages. St Ann's has the fifth smallest proportion of open space of all Haringey wards.



DEMOGRAPHICS


POPULATION AGE, ST ANN'S

- St Ann's overall population spread mirrors that seen in Haringey more widely, with those aged 20-44 making up the largest proportion of residents (50.7%), and those aged 65+ making up the smallest proportion (8.5%).
- While following the wider borough pattern, the 20-44 year old age group is particularly overrepresented in St Ann's compared to other wards, while all other age groups are slightly underrepresented.




ETHNICITY, ST ANN'S

- In St Ann's those of White Other ethnicity represent the largest group (31.2%). This group is overrepresented in St Ann's compared to the Haringey average.
- Those of White British ethnicity (23.1%) make up the second largest ethnic group in St Ann's, though this group is under-represented in the ward compared to the wider borough (34.7%).



RELIGION, ST ANN'S

- Religion in St Ann's largely follows the wider borough pattern, with Christianity (46.5%) the main religion and Islam representing the second largest religion (17.1%).
- St Ann's has a very small proportion of Jewish residents (0.7%) compared to Haringey more widely (3%).

EDUCATION & QUALIFICATIONS

% PUPILS MEETING THE EXPECTED STANDARD AT KEY STAGE 2, ST ANN'S

- St Ann's has a smaller proportion of pupils meeting the expected standard at KS2 level (54.2%) than the average in either Haringey (65.7%) or London (70%).
- This is the third lowest rate in the borough.



% PUPILS ACHIEVING GRADES 9-4 IN ENGLISH & MATHS, ST ANN'S

- In St Ann's, the proportion of pupils achieving grades 9-4 in English & Maths GCSEs (52.7%) is substantially lower than the Haringey and London averages (64.8% and 67.9% respectively).
 This is the second lowest rate of all wards in the borough.
- There is substantial variation in GCSE attainment among different Haringey wards, ranging from 46.3% achieving grades 9-4 in English & Maths, to 87.2%.

% QUALIFICATIONS AT LEVEL 3 AND ABOVE, ST ANN'S

- In St Ann's, the proportion of residents with qualifications at level 3 or higher (44.7%) is below the Haringey (50.4%) and London (50%) averages.
- There is substantial variation in qualification level among different Haringey wards, ranging from 29% being qualified to level 3 or higher, to 75.6%.



INCOME, EMPLOYMENT & TENURE

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME, ST ANN'S

• The median household income in St Ann's is £32,460 a year. This is below the Haringey (£37,696) and London (£39,264) averages, though it is not among the lowest levels of all Haringey wards.

UNEMPLOYMENT, ST ANN'S

• 8.9% of St Ann's residents are unemployed. This is slightly higher than both the Haringey (8.6%) and London (7.3%) averages.


JSA CLAIMANTS, ST ANN'S

- In St Ann's there are 112.1 JSA claimants for every 10,000 residents.
- This is slightly below the Haringey level, but above London (121.4 per 10,000 residents and 63.1 per 10,000 residents respectively).
- The rate of JSA claimants in Haringey is almost double the London rate.




HOUSING TENURE, ST ANN'S

- St Ann's households are most likely to be lived in by the homeowner (37.7%), though a similar proportion of households are socially rented (35.6%).
- Privately rented households are slightly over-represented in St Ann's compared to Haringey, while socially rented households are slightly under-represented (23.6%).



HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION, ST ANN'S

- In St Ann's, household composition broadly follows the pattern seen in Haringey more widely.
- Households in this ward are however more likely than average to be in the 'other' category, such as couple households with non-dependent children, or house shares.



FEMALE LIFE EXPECTANCY, ST ANN'S


• Female life expectancy in St Ann's is 85.3 years, above the Haringey (84.6) and London (84.4) averages.

MALE LIFE EXPECTANCY, ST ANN'S


Male life expectancy in St Ann's is 79.9 years, in line with the Haringey (79.9) and London (80.1) averages.

RESIDENTS WITH A LIMITING LONG-TERM HEALTH PROBLEM OR DISABILITY, ST ANN'S


In St Ann's 17.9% of residents have a limiting long-term health problem or disability. This is slightly higher than the rate seen in Haringey (16.7%) and London (16.4%) more widely.

% PREVALENCE OF EXCESS WEIGHT IN YEAR 6, ST ANN'S

• 42.9% of Year 6 children in St Ann's have excess weight. This is above the Haringey (36.1%) and London (36.8%) averages, though not among the highest rates of all Haringey wards.



RATE OF CRIME, ST ANN'S

- In St Ann's there were 192 crimes per 1,000 residents between February 2017 and January 2019 (this relates to any type of crime, from drug use or theft to violence against the person).
- This was lower than the Haringey and in line with London levels (224 per 1,000 residents and 187 per 1,000 residents respectively), though it is not among the lowest levels in Haringey.
- The rate of crime in Haringey is more than 19% above the London rate.
