1500s

This Great oak located in Bruce Castle Park is the oldest tree in Haringey.



1700s

Luke Howard born 1772 "The Namer of Clouds" Blue Plaque awarded Bruce Grove Tottenham N17.



1862

Alexandra Palace designed and built using materials from 1862 International Exhibition in Kensington.

1925

Allotment Act required local authorities to consider the provision of allotments when building houses.



1938

Lordship Rec "Model Traffic Area" which was officially opened in July at a cost of £6,000. This was the 1st of its kind in England and was a major event both locally and nationally.



1940

Nurseries popular in 19th century - used greenhouses to produce crops for London markets. Dwindled with increasing house development in the area and most were gone by the onset of World War 2 (WW2).



1950

Height of Design The Gestetner works opened in 1906 at Tottenham Hale, north London, employing thousands of people until the 1990s, operating in 153 different countries. Producing duplicating machines, stencils, styli, ink rollers and related products.

Muswell Hill Odeon Grade II listed Art Deco cinema, converted to three screens in 1974 but retaining its fine original decor.



1980

Environment Festival and Planting of a cherry tree, in memory of Hiroshima, by members of CND, with Mayor Vernon King. 6th August 1987.

Coldfall School 'Fabulous' Muswell Hill primary school squad wins eco award.

2000

Greenest Borough Strategy launched, car free day Wood Green High Street 2008.



1990

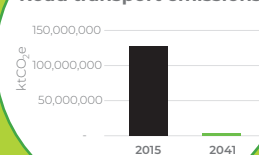
Tottenham Marshes cover 100 acres and is part of Lea Valley Park. An Example of semi-rural wetlands.
