Invented Histories - local histories will be telling you fantasy tales of Crouch End.

Sunday School - showcasing the best of our young talent from local schools at the Music Palace.

The Crouch End Guerrilla Bunting Project turning donations of fabric into bunting packs. The resulting bunting, over 1000
a. pieces, made by everyone from school kids to pensioners, will be displayed around Crouch End during the festival. Money raised goes to Cancer Research UK.
