
# Harringay Green Lanes

Green Lanes Transport for London (TfL) Corridor Scheme Green Lanes Outer London Fund (OLF) Town Centre Improvements

### Introduction

Haringey Council is delivering two schemes in the Green Lanes area. The Green Lanes Town Centre Improvements scheme, funded by the Mayor's Outer London Fund (OLF) and the Green Lanes Corridor scheme, funded by Transport for London (TfL). Both schemes aim to make various improvements along the Green Lanes Corridor.

A summary of the project aspirations and proposals are shown below:

#### ★ Green Lanes TfL Corridor scheme:

The section of Green Lanes from Endymion Road to Falkland Road is being considered for the improvements listed below (where feasible):

- Widen and renew footways (where affordable)
- Improve and relocate formal and informal crossings
- Renew footways outside shops and businesses
- Parking / loading bays raised to footway level to maximise footway widths when unoccupied and protect vehicles when occupied
- Raised level road surfaces and junction entry treatments may be installed on the highway at various locations throughout the scheme. This will reduce vehicle speed and prioritise pedestrians, contributing to a safer environment for all users
- Relocate bus stops to more logical and accessible locations
- New trees
- Decluttering of signage
- New bins, cycle stands and benches
- Contraflow cycling may be introduced where possible on the one-way streets off Green Lanes to allow cyclists to travel in both directions
- Proposed removal of the peak-hour bus lane from St. Ann's Road to the overground station (Subject to TfL approval)

#### **★** Green Lanes OLF Town Centre Improvements

#### Overground Bridge and Public Realm / Streetscape improvements

The TfL Corridor scheme improvements listed above will be complemented by a series of more place-specific treatments funded by the OLF scheme within Harringay Green Lanes Town Centre, which may include the improvements listed below:

- Feature lighting; to include tree lights, lighting suspended between buildings and up-lighting of key building facades
- Bespoke seats / resting points
- Special signage highlighting local attractions in the vicinity of Green Lanes to include: painted flank walls, illuminated signs, hanging signs and engraved granite kerb pieces
- Event infrastructure (power sockets)
- Tree planting and landscaped planters
- High quality granite kerb pieces

The key public spaces to be improved as part of the OLF scheme are identified on the plan to the right. These include the Overground Bridge improvements, identified as Area No.1.

#### **Shop Front improvements**

The OLF will also be delivering a series of Shop Front Improvements throughout the Town Centre area (marked red on the opposite plan). These will require a 20% buy-in from participating traders to provide improvements such as new awnings, fascia signs, timber shopfronts and the restoration of upper building facades. Improvements will be delivered in close conjunction with the Green Lanes Traders Association.

### **3** Roseberry Gardens and Duckett Road

- Widened footways (removal of left / right filter lanes to provide a shorter crossing point and expanded pedestrian environment)
  - Raised pedestrian crossings
  - Building facade uplighting
  - Catenary (suspended) feature lighting above
  - Make space for potential outside eating areas
  - Special terrazzo mats outside corner units
  - Granite kerb seating
  - New tree planting
  - Painted flank wall signage

### 4 St. Ann's Road junction

- Narrowed carriageways
- Raised pedestrian crossings
- Building facade uplighting
- Lighting treatment to The Salisbury 'Crown'
- Outside seating area for The Salisbury
- Special terrazzo / mosaic 'welcome mat'
- Large special granite seat
- The Salisbury column 'totem'
- New tree planting
- Cycle parking
- Screen to unsightly bins

### **5** Allison Road junction

- Raised pedestrian crossing
- "Green screen" to church fence
- Illuminated "New River" sign
- Tree lights to mature trees
