- The canoe club could collaborate with the New River Festival volunteers and its open day could coincide with the festival date (Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> September).
   Possibility of tasters and coaching sessions. The club is currently bidding for funding to work with 19-25yr olds in Woodberry Down. Suggested by Michele de Broglio

Action: Michele to make enquiries with Canoe Club representatives

 The area further north of the PACT area in Harringay could be opened up – gate/ fence could be opened and access given to the waterway by Thames Water-Suggestion by Hugh Flouch

Action: Thames Water to be contacted

- Open space next to Rowley Gardens leads down to the New River. This will be opened up in April 2013 providing an accessible area of green space for activities/ stalls. Raised by Marc McKenna and Geoff Bell
- Skinners School could be a location for activities to take place, either on their playground or inside, or both.

Action: Vivien Macdona to contact head teacher

- Activities can take place at London Wildlife Trust East Reservoir Centre- LWT are a PACT project partner
- Finsbury Park Amphitheatre- Park Manager is keen to get this into use more. Action: Jo Homan to provide his contact details

## d. Ideas for activities

- Music centre- steel band, big band, guitar group Also South Haringey Junior School gardening club Action: Michele de Broglio to make enquiries
- School projects during summer term 2013 on the New River- results could be displayed at the festival Action: Draw up suggestions for activities which children could work on. List of schools in PACT area to be made and contact established
- River boat competition- creating rafts to float objects down a stretch of the river.
  Action: Seek advice on this regarding wildlife safety- consult London Wildlife Trust and Thames Water.
- Sadlers Wells- aquatic theatre. Look into a photo display or recreation.
  Action: Sarah Peters (artist) to find link to Islington blog post
- Offer of use of 200 capacity festival tent from Ruth Larbey and Will Collins, dependent on space and flat surface. Could hold stage and/or café Action: Contact to be made with Haringey Council re feasibility
- Art project, exhibition and interactive river-route map being set up by local artists
  Henny Beaumont and Sarah Peters
- Oral History of New River project is being set up by Geoff Bell, Woodberry Down Community Organisation member
