

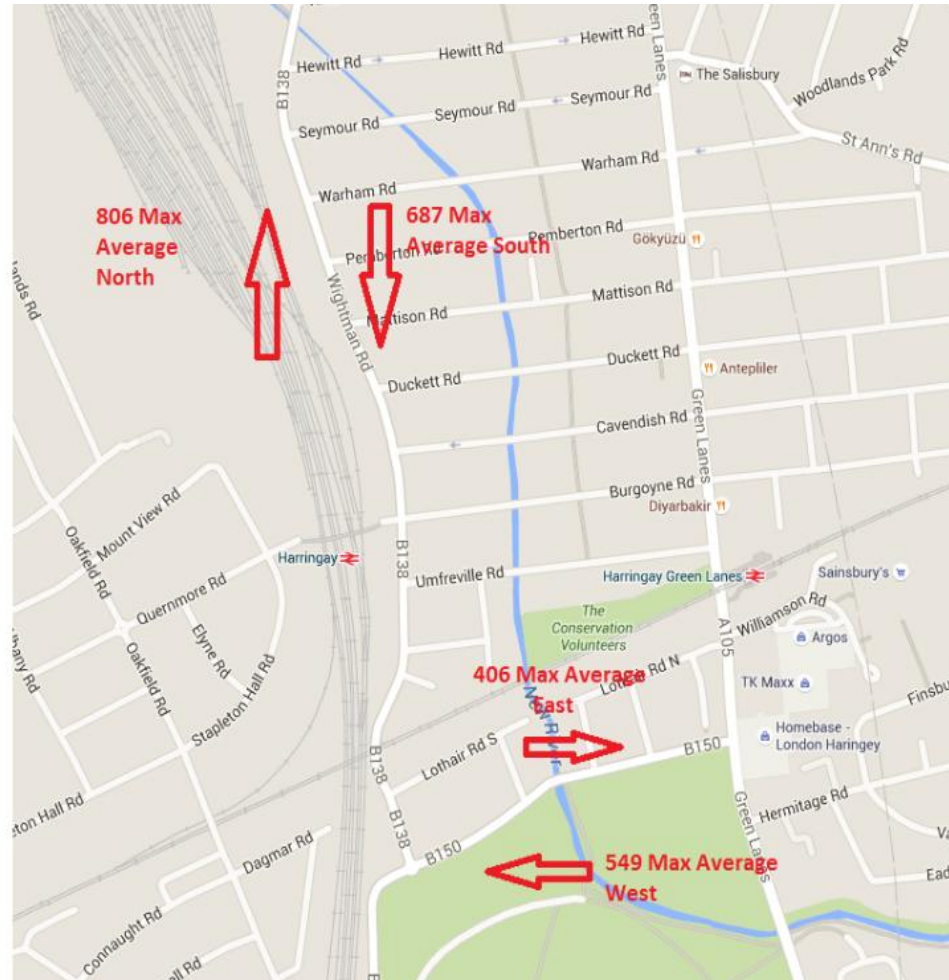

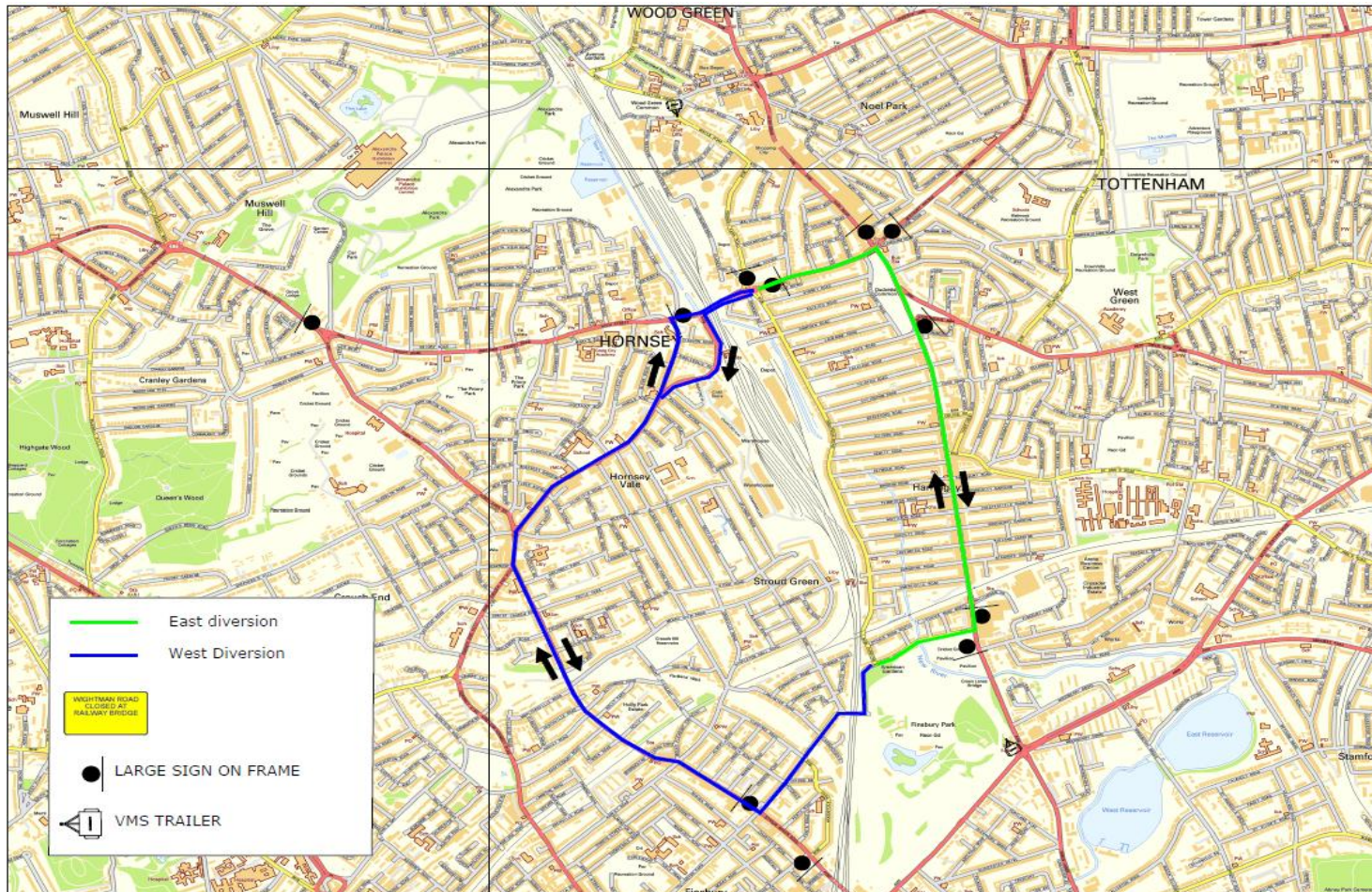

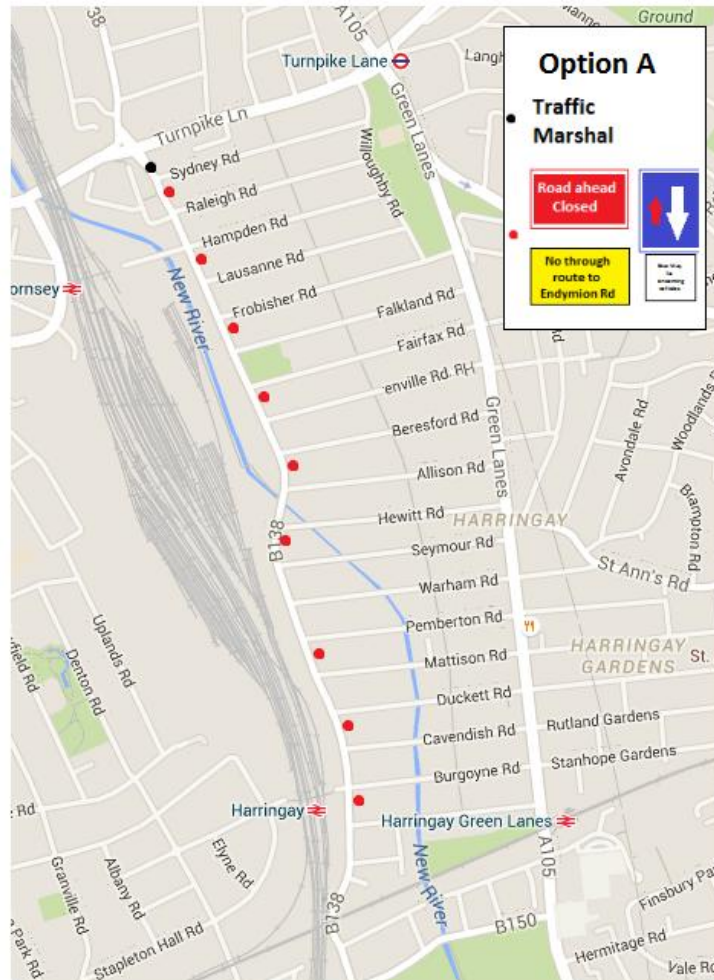


Road closure Traffic Management

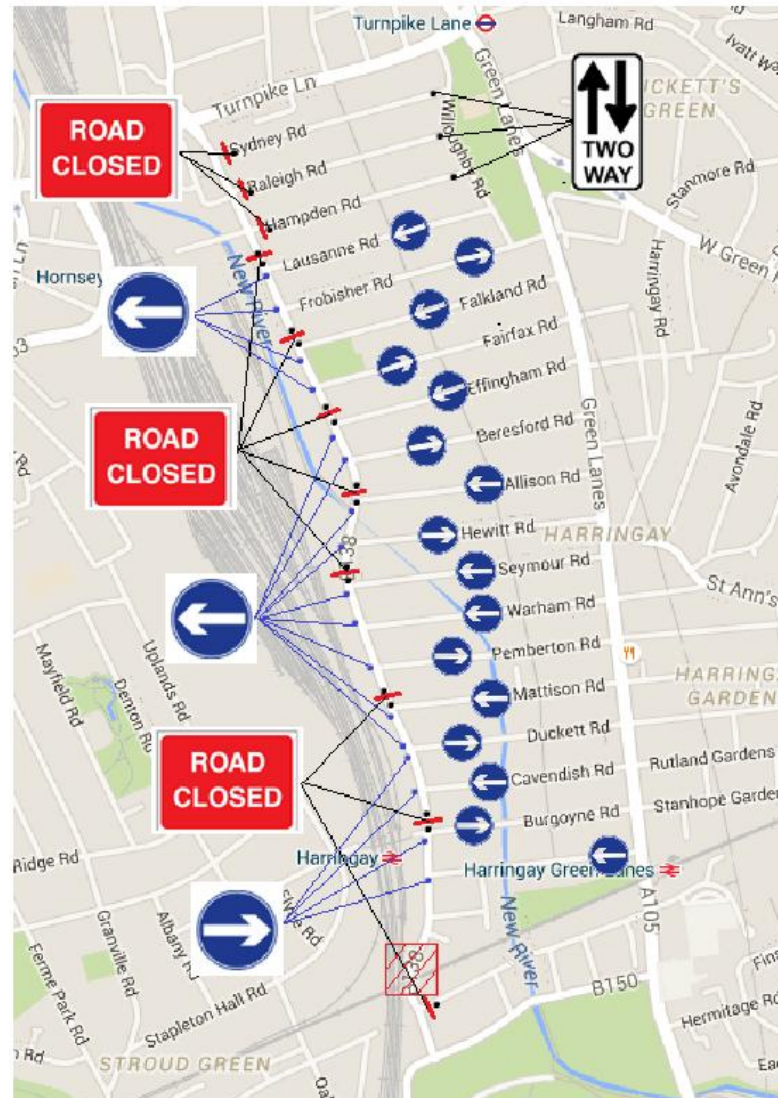

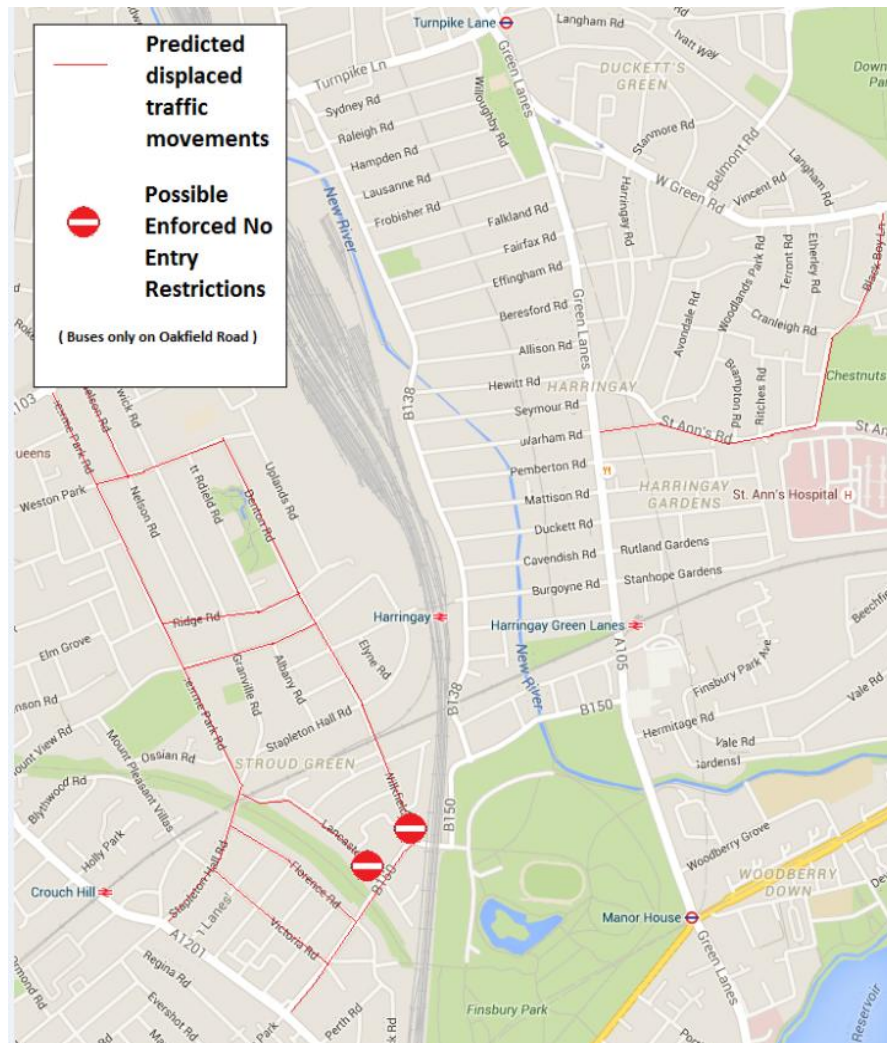

Displaced traffic

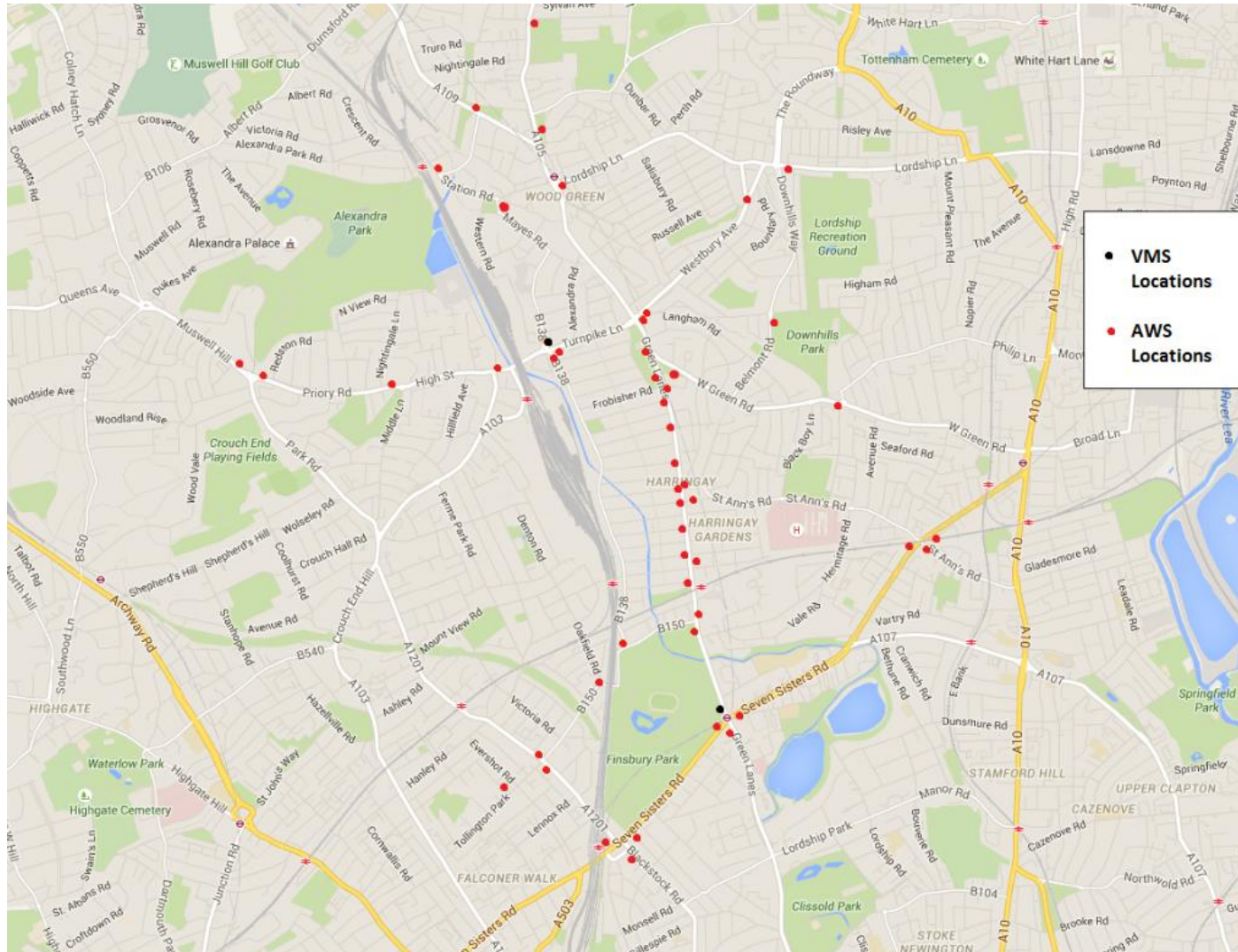


Mitigation

- Advance warning signs (AWS) and Variable Message Signs (VMS) on approaching routes
- Works affecting traffic flows prohibited on streets expected to experience additional use.
- Information shared with neighbouring boroughs, LT Buses and TfL

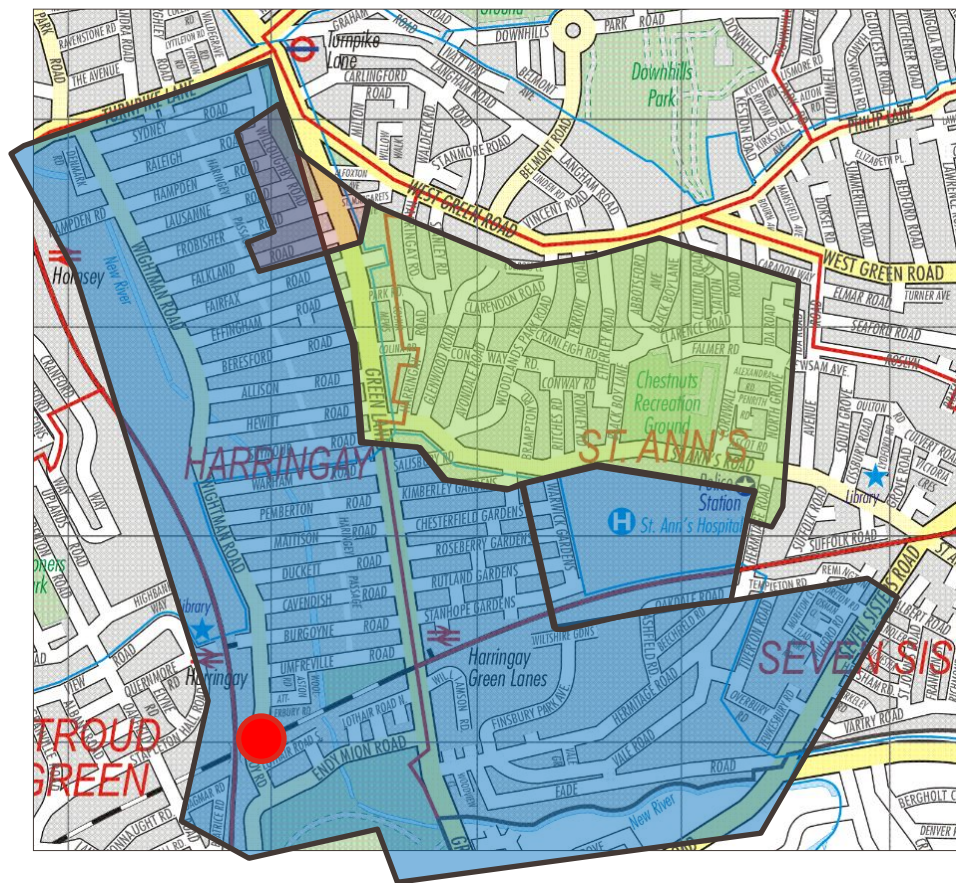

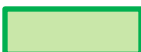

Breakdown of Study Area

- Alfoxton Avenue/Frobisher Road Area;
- Ladder Roads Area
- Gardens Roads Area;
- Green Lanes;
- Wightman Road;
- Hermitage Road Area.

Aims of Study

Identify

- Measures to improve the urban realm
- Measures to rationalise traffic volume and route in establishing a more equitable distribution of traffic within area
- Measures to improve road safety for all road users and enhance accessibility for pedestrians and cyclists
- Enhance bus service journey time and reliability
- Assess impacts of future developments within the study area and neighbouring boroughs on traffic flows within the study area
- Assess long term impacts of the closure of Wightman Road (except for access) on traffic flows.

6-Stage Delivery Process

Stage 1:

☐ Inception meetings

✓ With Haringey Officers WC 11th January 2016

✓ Councillors & Community Groups WC 18th January 2016

☐ Data Gathering

✓ Initial set of traffic surveys to be undertaken before Wightman Road Bridge closure

✓ Other data such as collision and condition surveys

Stage 2:

☐ Community Engagements (*to occur throughout the study period*)

✓ Meeting with Community Group once per month

✓ Attendance of Resident Association meeting

✓ Updates on Haringey Website

Stage 3:

☐ Traffic modelling

✓ Develop localised traffic model

✓ Validate the traffic model

6-Stage Delivery Process

Stage 4:

☐ Options Development & Testing

- ✓ Undertake traffic movement study
- ✓ Development and test options upon agreement with steering group.

Stage 5:

☐ Public Consultation

- ✓ Area wide consultation
- ✓ Drop-in session

Stage 6:

☐ Final Report

- ✓ Feedback to stakeholders on final proposals
- ✓ Submission of final report by Consultant
